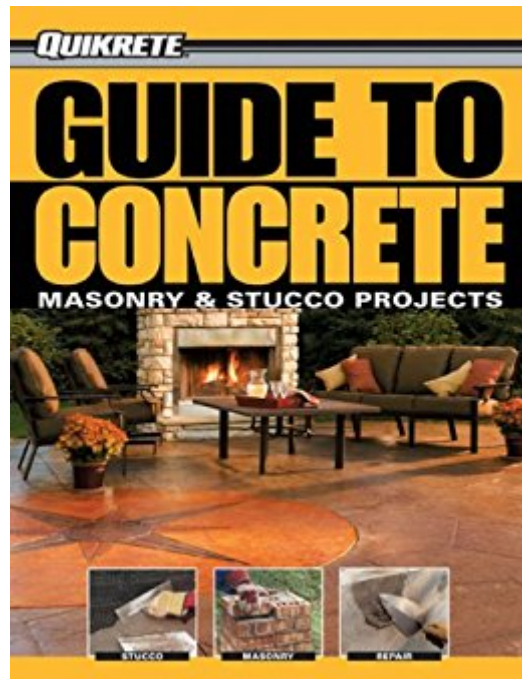

I am a do-it-yourself home improvement guy that has spent a lot of money on various books on all kinds of home improvement topics. This book is by far the best for concrete ideas and the how-to of tackling these projects at home. Other books I have purchased provide nice pictures and a finished product picture but do not provide the level of detail that this book shows on how to tackle these projects. Some of these may seem basic and I may not follow the exact methodology that this book presented; however, I greatly appreciate what was provided since it gives me a basis for how to move forward with some concrete projects.

The Kindle Edition is horrible. The problem is that the pictures are tiny and you learning nothing from the pictures. At the same time I purchased the paper edition and it is great ---- 5 STAR!. Most Kindle books are like this. I have the book on wiring and framing. the Kindle editions are awful when (in fact) the paper editions are wonderful.
